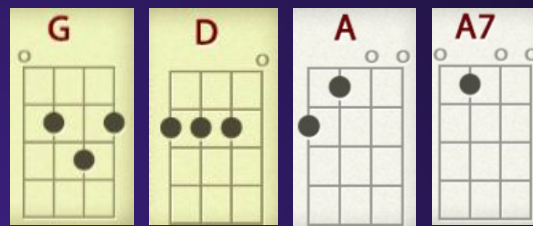


Little Honda by Brian Wilson and Mike Love 1964

[A] Faster, it's all [A7] right.

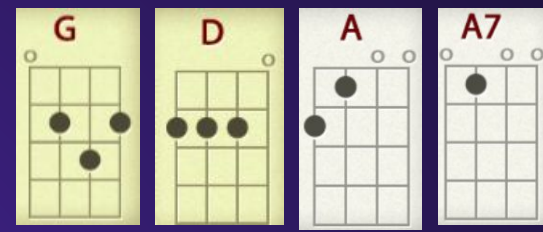
SECOND VERSE:

[A] Faster, it's all [A7] right.

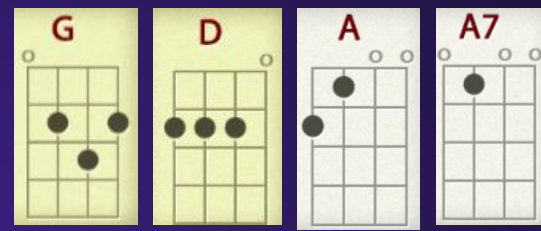
THIRD VERSE:

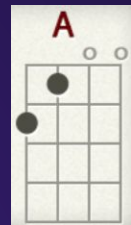
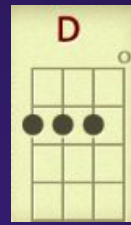
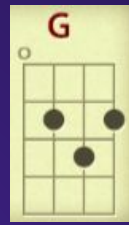
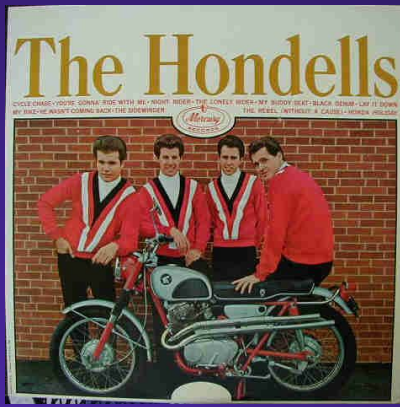
It climbs the [D] hills like a Matchless
